65TH CCW ANNUAL CONVENTION HIGHLIGHTS: STORY BY HEIDY CARVER

We started out the Convention being thankful for decent weather for all of us traveling. Approximately 900 Cattleman and CattleWomen attended to celebrate the 100th Anniversary of CCA & the 65th Anniversary of CCW. Siskiyou County CattleWomen had 20 members attend. As always, the Nugget was a nice venue and very accommodating.

Thursday afternoon started with Media Training presented by Daren Williams from NCBA. He specializes in training people to give media interviews to reporters. Common beef-related interview topics are meat safety, meat nutritional value, animal care, and environmental stewardship. His interview preparation list included: Be prepared for any type of questions, set a date and time for interview, know the target audience, keep the story you're telling to 2-3 key points and repeat your message multiple times, make it personal, do not just have facts and figures, never speak off the record, avoid 'no comment' or arguing, and do not "trash" the other side with negative comments. He had some great stories to illustrate the do's and don'ts when being interviewed.

Some of us attended the CCW Executive Committee Meeting on Thursday afternoon. The digitized CCW logo designed by Deb Cockrell was approved and will be available for use soon. CCW is still continuing trying to increase its

ANCW members. Currently 182 CCW members have not renewed their ANCW membership dues, which were due October 1, 2016 and will be delinquent December 31, 2016. The CCW Panel Raffle income will continue be split 50% to winning ticket selling unit and 50% to CCW with 10% of funds being used for CCW scholarships.

As always, there were a lot of informative guest speakers. Some of the CCA guest speakers were Mark Blakeman from ATT Cellular Service who spoke about the recent use of Federal Government CAF subsidies to improve cellular service and broadband internet in rural areas. With the use of GPS in many types of farm equipment, better service is needed. Next was Brett Stuart from Global AgriTrends who spoke the historical and current trends in the world beef markets. The world beef market is influenced by politics, culture, currency rates, and economic status. The cost of ag food products has been very volatile since 2007. When consumers have more disposable income, they buy higher quality ag products. The global beef market has a steady demand with such a large world population that needs



food. However the global beef supply cannot increase quick enough to meet the demand due to the time it takes to increase beef herd numbers. Much of the US Beef export is to Asia. So the future of the global beef market looks promising from a producers standpoint.

On Friday, the CCW President's Breakfast was informative with lots of sharing by county unit presidents. Then we enjoyed a wonderful Cowbelle of the Year luncheon that had record setting attendance and proudly honored our own Melanie Fowle along with 26 other hard-working honorees. In the afternoon, the CCW Workshop was held. The CA Beef Council presented the new smartphone app called BEEFabulous which is a guide to beef nutrition facts, beef cut purchasing, coupons and cooking recipes, beef ranching facts, and provides many links to other beef related websites. It is geared primarily towards the Millennial consumers and will be available to the public by January 2017. Also a great informative beef pocket notebook of Beef Facts is available from the Beef Council to help educated people outside of the Beef industry on the benefits that beef cattle provide to the environment and nutritionally. Siskiyou County is well represented as Cheryl Foster is CCW President, Tara Porterfield is Secretary, Michele Murphy is Membership Chair, Melanie Fowle is Beef Promotion Chair and Sharon Erickson will serve on the Keep It Fun committee.

The CCW Board Meeting was the final gathering of the convention for most cattlewomen. 27 of the 30 unit presidents were in attendance, along with approximately 100 members. CCW is doing well financially and the 2017 Budget

was approved. The Heritage Foundation for scholarships is doing well also. CCW voted to sponsor \$1,000 each to the current 3 California Senior Beef Ambassadors in order for them to attend the ANCW Cattle Industry Convention in Nashville, TN at end of January 2017 to participate in the new young leadership roundtable program. The 2016 Farm to Fork Event in Sacramento was well attended with approximately 75,000 people and CCW was able to educate many people about the beef industry.

Siskiyou members may not have gambled much, but we had good luck with raffles! Holli Murphy and Heidy Carver each won 50" Flat Screen televisions that were sponsored by Silveus Insurance Group at the trade show. Lynda Beverlin won a gift basket during the Cowbelle of the Year luncheon. Many of us won items at the CCW Board Meeting raffle, plus we found many nice items at the trade show. The CCA 100th Anniversary ranch book is very nice and the CCW booth had a lot of neat items for sale by the county units.
