SPRING CCW BEEF PROMOTION WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS: STORY BY JEAN BARTON

Melanie Fowle, CCW Beef Promotion chair was recognized for the excellent Beef Education workshop on Saturday March 13th for 100 pre-registered CCW members. Highlights of the day were Malorie Bankhead with her "Decide to be Positive" presentation. She looks forward to tap dancing, and her goal was to share more sunshine, more smiles, have traditions that make you happy, believing in magic as she put on her tap dance shoes and danced for us. She mentioned her father was a five year Pancreatic cancer survivor, and little did we know he was dying, since she was so positive. "Positive persistence can lead to happiness. Happiness is a small victory." A powerful motivational speech.

Sheila Bowen, presented Kern Co. CowBelle/CattleWomen history, using fashions from each decade modeled by members. Candy Peterson shared her ranch set of Little Busters toys and corrals that has been to high schools as well as grammar schools. "I brought my ranch to you." A large poster with the different breeds of beef cattle and country of origin was on display.

Barbara Martin, 3rd generation, started Dairy Goddess Farmstead Cheese and shared her story of how 2009 changed everything for dairy industry, when milk check didn't cover feed bill. She became an

entrepreneur, after learning how to make cheese at Cal Poly, making fresh cheese in three days instead of months.

'Shortcuts to Professional Booths', was shared by Debbie Hay and Kern Co. ladies. "Invest in quality props. They can be used over and over again." Need a barrier for booth, and used a fence. Lighting is

important. Sign companies can make "Fat Heads" for lifesize animal displays, "green grass" carpet came from Costco.

For fun, we learned to Draw a Cow with Victoria Brussow. Paper is landscape, instead of portrait. Then two circles, connecting a half arch; draw a line on left circle, making it a T. Draw a rectangle around T. Two small circles, and a half circle in front. Parallel lines off circle, for start of leg. Little circle for knuckle. 2 more parallel lines off little circle. Half circle at bottom for hoof. Eyes are a circle at bottom of T. Nose is) (on bottom and rectangle for chin. Ears are half

circles, with line in opening. Horns are banana shape above ears. Tail is a curved line with teardrop for tail. Use eraser and remove the inside circle lines and T, add a Brand on hip, or your initials, and add grass for standing in. She also told us the history of cows in art, from tombs 350BC to current, and Andy Warhol in a 1966 print on wall paper.

Annette Kassis, from California Beef Council shared information on Marketing to Millennials, including don't talk down to them. Need to reach where they are, with point of sale shoppers. <u>CalBeef.org</u> is new website. BEEFabulous is a new free mobile App for consumers that provides cooking, shopping tips, etc. Ibotta is an App for smart phones that is better than coupons. Cinco de Mayo will be celebrated with beef promotion efforts in urban cities in CA. Materials Madness followed when the units received their beef promotion materials from the beef council.

BEEF PROMOTION WORKSHOP HIGHLIGHTS: CONTINUED

Following a delicious luncheon of Flank Steak Spinach Salad or Tri Tip Sandwich on the patio, we learned hands-on lessons in five rotating groups about things to share in the classroom from Beef Education Resources, 2016 Update, and from the American Farm Bureau Foundation for Agriculture through funding by the Beef Checkoff.

1. Lynda Beverlin shared **Beef Basics**, (by–products made from beef) with a game similar to 52 pickup, but we dropped the cards in hula hoop circles, as we matched common beef by-products to their source, for $K - 5^{th}$ Grade.

 What's for Dinner, with Lori and Rita March, showed the group they didn't know all the cuts of beef as well as thought. We had large laminated Angus Beef Charts from the American Angus Association with Velcro on the chuck, rib, short loin, sirloin, etc. The small individual cuts of beef were laminated and velcroed. Where do you place a blade roast, ribeye steak, cubed steak, tbone steak, eye round roast? It was a great refresher of all the different beef cuts and where they are located in the carcass.
Taste and Nutrition with Debbie Torres was planning a nutritious meal using beef, and she also shared a variety of sources of free education materials to share in presentations.
Caring for Cattle, with Melanie Fowle used an orange and volunteer to demonstrate the intramuscular, subcutaneous

vaccine shots. Also used a photo of a meadow, mountain, cattle grazing to illustrate what you are 'really' seeing – lessons from the Farm Bureau Ag In The Classroom materials.

5. Then Candy Peterson and Mid-Valley CowBelles demonstrated their fun, educational **Beef Ping Pong Game**, as we tried to throw a ping pong ball into a cup. Each cup represented a beef nutritional fact for points. Think of ZIP, zinc, iron, protein with vitamins, too. My team was losing, until we brought in a Mid-Valley "ringer" who could make baskets! The afternoon concluded with a dynamic beef heart dissection lesson for classrooms that are already studying the heart and circulatory system. This lesson was created to further connect elementary age youth with an early spark for science education, as well as an opportunity to bring agricultural information to the classroom. This demonstration was directed by Jacki Zediker, UCCE Siskiyou, and has been successfully used by Siskiyou Co. CattleWomen and Siskiyou Co. 4-H. It was a wonderful day of beef education and promotion!
