Hello Ladies and Happy Spring!!

If April showers bring May flowers, Siskiyou County should be brimming with blooms next month, and we are thankful for the moisture! 2019 is off and running for Siskiyou CattleWomen, with both new and traditional beef promotion, education, fundraising and community involvement activities! We are excited about the upcoming Spring SCCW meeting on April 27th with the new time format of holding the business meeting in late afternoon, followed by a fun "Beef & Wine Pairing" presentation/taste testing

We truly hope many of you can join us on the 27th - the plan is to keep the business meeting portion short, thus current committee reports/updates will be sent to all members, along with the January general meeting minutes, the week before the general meeting. It was approved at the January meeting to discontinue the SCCW Sandwich Booth at the Fair and replace it with other beef promotion activities during the fair. The board and chairmen are working on the new beef promotion activities for the fair, and one new fundraiser will be SCCW providing the concession dinner at the Montague Balloon Fair in September this year - we will be the primary food vendor for the Friday night Glow Event that had 1000 people attend last year. The Western Quilt project will also be a fundraiser, along with the annual Panel Raffle tickets sales.

There are a few other highlights of our activities included in this newsletter, but please review the reports to come for more details, as SCCW does have quite a few new and exciting activities happening this year as a result of the earlier BP&F committee brain storming sessions. #### 2019 SPRING CCW WORKSHOP & TOUR HIGHLIGHTS: STORY BY CHERYL FOSTER

Siskiyou County made a very strong showing at CCW's Spring Meeting in Visalia, CA. Eleven women drove down. President Tara Porterfield, Rebecca Broomell, Melanie Fowle, Leanne Brown, Heidy Carver, Cheryl Foster, Sharon Erickson, Stacey Jackson, Lynda Beverlin, Carolyn Houghton and Emma Morris.

This was a joint meeting with California Women for Ag and California CattleWomen. We join up occasionally at this Spring meeting because there are many similarity's in our efforts to promote Ag.

We were fortunate to have Mark Lacey California Cattlemen Association be our first speaker. He was completing a state tour promoting the California Cattle Council referendum. He spoke about the referendum but also how he wanted to strengthen the ties between Cattlemen and CattleWomen.

Judy Culbertson for Ag in the Classroom spoke to us about their efforts in continuing to meet the needs of teachers by providing content and aids for teachers. Ag in the Classroom has a teaching box for teachers new to the Ag in the Classroom program. The colorful box contains Ag education materials and a teacher's guide for all things AG. Judy brought with her lots of great Ag in the Classroom materials for ladies to take back to their



programs. Judy presented the California Women for Ag the GALA award that CCW won last year.

Shannon Douglass 1st VP of California Farm Bureau spoke to us about having a strong story. How we are the voice of our businesses and customers will believe us when we speak from our hearts and speak about what we know. We do not have to state lots of facts and figures we just need to be ourselves and tell our positive story.

California Beef Council Producer Outreach Coordinator Jill Scofield showed us a couple of the beef promotion videos that had recently been released on social media. She talked about "Chuck" the virtual reality beef app that will answer any question about beef.

California Beef Council lead nutritionist Damon McCunne told us about his efforts in correcting the information about the power of animal protein vs plant protein. He showed how nutrition dense a beef portion is to an equal amount of plant protein and the number of calories it takes to equal the same percentage of protein intake.

We car pooled to a tour of the J.D. Heiskell feed mill in Tulare. The company has been in business since 1886 and currently prepares custom feed mixes for local dairies. Their Plant Manager led us on a walking tour of the warehouse, grinding and mixing stations. They receive their corn via rail cars - a full trainload at a time and must have them all unloaded within 72 hours. They go through those all those rail car loads of corn every week. J.D. Heiskell works with the nutritionists at the dairy's to figure out their specific targeted feed mixes. We were all outfitted in hard hats, safety glasses and orange vests.



That evening we were greatly entertained by Sharon Erickson and Debbie Hay at dinner doing their hilarious "You Might Be A Rancher's Wife If..." sayings.
