2020 SISKIYOU COUNTY CATTLEWOMAN OF THE YEAR

Siskiyou CattleWomen announced Caroline Luiz of Fort Jones as the 2020 CattleWoman of the Year at the 65th Anniversary meeting and celebration in Dorris. Caroline was born into a fourth-generation cattle ranch (Costa Santos Ranch) in the Scott Valley area of Siskiyou County. Caroline worked all aspects of the ranch from changing irrigation to vaccinating cattle and moving them to the mountain grazing. With her family's ties to the industry, she began promoting beef and educating others long before joining CattleWomen.

Caroline worked for many years alongside her parents Joe and Maxine Santos and her uncle Arlen Costa before taking over the day to day operations completely in 2010. Caroline continues to work with her two daughters Nicole Stevens and Keri Daniels and their families to manage the ranch. She started her own registered herd of polled Hereford cattle in 1969 and showed them through 4-H at many local fairs and state events.

Caroline has been an active member of the Siskiyou County CattleWomen for more than 34 years. She is a dedicated "behind the scenes" member who is always willing to help with various activities, events and committees. She consistently attends the SCCW general membership meetings to stay informed and be involved.

Caroline spent countless years helping to make sauce for the barbecue sandwich booth and working multiple shifts at the Siskiyou Golden Fair. She has been the Top Hand Committee Chair since the program was started in 2001. She always makes pies for the annual Cattle Health Meeting and has spent time helping to promote beef with the walking taco booths. She has chaired the Feature booth committee for both the Siskiyou Golden Fair and the Tulelake Butte Valley fair and helped work the promotional booth on the Midway at the fair. When the CattleWomen took on the challenge of making the lunches or dinners for the auction buyers at the fair, she was there to help make it work.
