Beef Promotion

Siskiyou County CattleWomen have held three beef promotions so far this calendar year! We started off with Heart Healthy Beef for Valentine's Day, partnering with local meat markets to give away a \$25 gift certificate for beef. Then we celebrated St. Patrick's Day by giving away corned beef at the meat markets.

On Mother's Day, we had an informational booth at the Mother's Day Market at the Siskiyou Golden Fairgrounds. Members who manned the booth shared important information about beef nutrition, grazing to reduce wildfires, beef vs fake meat, positive beef industry practices, and lots of recipes. We had a drawing for a \$25 gift certificate to the Miner Street Meat Market. There were 394 tickets in the drawing which means we reached over 400 people, as not everyone we spoke to entered the drawing.

And we have started our fourth beef promotion - get ready for **BEEF for Father's Day!** With eateries now opening up for more indoor dining, we have teamed up with *five* local restaurants to promote beef: Jefferson Roadhouse, Denny Bar, 5 Mary's Burgerhouse, Etna Brewing, and Slice of Heaven! During Father's Day Weekend, each customer who orders a beef meal will get an entry ticket to the drawing for a \$100 gift certificate at that restaurant. And the server could win \$25!! This is a very popular and successful event we have held in the past but covid restrictions shut it down last year. Eleven Siskiyou County CattleWomen Travel to ANCW Region V Meeting

What a wonderful American National CattleWomen Region V Meeting in Pendleton, Oregon. The Region V ladies welcomed the California CattleWomen with open arms! There were 98 registered for the meeting. The Oregon and Washington CattleWomen were incredible hostesses with attendees from Montana, Colorado, Wyoming, and California. Oregon President Diana Wirth is from Klamath Falls, and Washington President Kady Porterfield is from Ellensburg.

We toured a beautiful ranch, the 9 Mile Ranch, which raises Red Angus cattle on 15,000 acres, spent time in Walla Walla checking out their awesome wines, listened to some great speakers who encouraged us to stand up for our industry and way of life, made new friends, watched a ranch rodeo, attended a trade show, learned a ton about the area, took an underground tour of Pendleton, and just relaxed.

Speakers included ANCW President Evelyne Greene from Alabama and American National CattleWomen President-Elect Reba Mazek introduced us to the Women in Leadership Development (WILD) program, Dave Duquette of Western Justice, and Tammy Denee, Oregon Cattlemen executive director, speaking on defining leadership in organizations, and Marji Guyler-Alaniz of the RFDTV show FarmHer, featuring women in agriculture.

Western Justice - A Voice for the Western Lifestyle

An impressive presentation that we heard during the ANCW Region V meeting was by Dave Duquette from Western Justice. He founded Western Justice, a non-profit organization to provide a voice for the western horse industry. The western horse industry is a big industry with the smallest voice in Washington DC. The western horse industry is a \$122 billion-dollar industry compared to the National Football League (NFL) at \$10 billion dollar industry. The goal of Western Justice is to protect the western horse industry from animal rights groups and to support and help the industry to grow.

Dave Duquette has worked with Protect the Harvest (protecttheharvest.com) advocacy organization in an effort to education and inform against activities of animal extremists' groups, anti-agriculture groups; protect the rights of people in agriculture; and respond to laws and regulations. Western Justice has a similar mission, just targeted to the western horse industry. Dave was instrumental in the prison pardon for the Hammonds from Oregon, utilizing his contacts in Washington DC.

Animal rights activists are working not only at the federal level, but also at the state and county levels to limit or stop activities that the western horse industry participates in. Examples include: Alameda County banned mutton busting last year; Los Angles is implementing a ban on rodeo, bull riding and other similar events (you can sign a petition on the Western Justice website); Colorado initiative 16 - animal cruelty law limiting when a beef can be slaughtered for food at one quarter of its lifespan at age 5 years for beef, age 3 ½ or pigs and sheep and age 2 years for chickens.

Western Justice differs in strategy from a lobbyist activity, where there are just a few donors to a long-term infrastructure that answers to all of the people involved in the western horse industry. To do this, they need members. When Dave talks to a Congressman or Senator or even the President, he can say that "I represent a million members." This gets the attention of leaders. Membership is just \$50 per year to provide protection to our way of life and the freedom to participate in the western way of life. 
