SCCW Siskiyou Golden Fair 2021 Commercial Booth Report

The SCCW Commercial Fair Booth for 2021 was a success! Our booth was a 10ft x 20ft space, which worked really well for displaying all of the art from the SCCW Beef Art Contest held in the spring.

- We also had an updated trivia wheel, thanks to Rebecca. The questions remained the same, but the wheel itself received a whole new makeover. We had plenty of pencils, stickers, tattoos and bumper stickers for the trivia wheel prizes.
- We had a nice display of brochures and recipes for people to take as desired.
- The kitchen display was set up and there were two cooking demonstrations, one on Thursday with Rebecca, Keely, and Jodi and the other one was on Friday with Sheila and Marina Kuck.
- We had a free raffle for \$25 gift cards at Miner Street Market. One was given away each day. There were lots of people who signed up for this raffle. Each night one ticket was drawn, and the non-winning tickets were prepared for discard. Each day started with new tickets.
- We also sold about \$800 in Powder River product tickets during the fair. John York, Basic Fencing, provided a Powder River gate for display and then offered it for us to sell at our annual Fall dinner.

We have seen people chain themselves to a tree or break into property to "save" an animal because of this emotional pull. How much more important is your way of life?

Consider the mission of Western Justice, a collaborative voice empowering the future of the western lifestyle, our livelihoods, and industry events. As a coalition, they are committed to upholding livestock owners, trainers, and exhibitors' rights and liberties while ensuring the welfare of animals.

To quote the Western Justice website, "Surprisingly, for such a large industry, the western lifestyle including ranching, equine lovers, farmer, and rodeo fans, our voice in Washington D.C. is *minimal*. The absence of an industry-focused group to address pertinent issues, such as bad legislation at the county, state, and federal levels is adversely affecting our industry at an accelerated pace.

Our strength is in our numbers, <u>more members equals more empowerment</u> and an influential voice when addressing threatening and debilitating legislation. It is imperative we unify to create a strong entity. Extremist groups' legislation is being aggressively pushed at the state and local levels through changes to state laws and county ordinances. It must be stopped."

You might ask, "What can I do? I am just one person. I do not have tons of money. I do not have extra time!" But you can do something! *Be a member who does one thing each year*. Just one thing. If each of us does one thing, that would be over 150 things!! Maybe you can recruit other members. Maybe you can work in a promotional booth. Maybe you can write letters or emails to legislators.
